Flood Prevention Checklist for Homeowners



GUTTERS AND DOWNSPOUTS	YARD
Clean gutters at least twice a year to prevent clogging.	Ensure your yard slopes away from your home so water naturally drains away.
Ensure downspouts direct water at least 5-10 feet away from your foundation.	Add soil where needed to improve grading around your foundation.
Check rain barrel drainage twice a year.	Consider adding a BMP.
SUMP PUMP	SEWER LINE
Install a sump pump in your basement to remove excess water. (Ensure pump has a backup power source in case of power outages.)	Install a backflow valve in your home's sewer line to prevent water from backing up into your home during heavy rain or flooding.
Ensure all drains are clear of debris.	Fix any leaks or clogs in your plumbing.
FOUNDATION	IF NECESSARY
Inspect your foundation for cracks or gaps where water could seep in.	Have sandbags or flood barriers on hand to protect low-lying doors, windows, or garages during heavy rains.
Seal any cracks with waterproof caulk or masonry sealer.	Stay informed with weather alerts & local emergency services to get timely info on potential flooding
