# ORGANIC WEED CONTROL RECIPES





## Vinegar-Based Herbicide

### Receipe:

- 1 gallon of white vinegar
- 1 cup of salt
- 1 tablespoon of dish soap

#### Instructions:

- 1. Mix the vinegar, salt, and dish soap in a large container.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a spray bottle.
- 3. Spray directly onto the weeds, avoiding contact with the plants you want to keep.
- 4. Apply on a sunny day for best results.



## **Boiling Water**

#### Instructions:

- 1. Boil a pot of water.
- 2. Carefully pour the boiling water directly onto the weeds.
- 3. This method is particularly effective for weeds growing in cracks and driveways.





A product of wet-milling corn, corn starch, germ oil meal, corn gluten feed, and steep liquor.

#### Instructions:

- 1. Apply corn gluten meal to the soil surface in early spring before weed seeds germinate.
- 2. Water the area lightly after application.
- 3. Reapply as necessary throughout the growing season.

#### Alternatives to Herbicides
